Opening Prayer:

Bible Verse:


"Don't delay giving to those in need." Sirach 4:1-10



Theme: To teach the students that although people are homeless, they are still valuable. Through our prayers, we can bring them new life like Jesus gave new life to those who were homeless and poor.

Did you know?

Neither the incarcerated nor homeless people should ever be denied dignity.



Discussion:

- Everything belongs to God. We need to share our gifts.
- There are many poor people in the world.
- People are homeless for many different reasons, and we will never know all the reasons.
- The most important thing we can do for them is to pray for them.
- Many of these people don't have any praying for them.



Questions? Write the answers in your journal.

- How can we help those who are homeless?
- Do we treat them differently? Why or why not?
- How do you think their families feel about them being homeless?
- What is something each one of us can do to help them?



Activity: Prayer Cards

- Have the students create prayer cards with inspirational quotes or images.
- Allow the students to use their Bibles to find appropriate scriptures.
- A simple, yet powerful, statement to write is "You are Loved."
- Include a prayer and a small drawing on the prayer cards.
- The students can also complete a Spiritual Bouquet.
- Either of these can be given to those who are homeless or incarcerated.
- Neither people who are homeless nor incarcerated are to ever be denied dignity.

Discussion:

Discuss the various quotes, scripture verses and prayers that they have chosen to put on the prayer cards and why those were chosen.



Closing Prayer:

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.
